Support for this position is first derived from the legislative history of these two Acts, a short but complicated history which itself reveals how rapidly environmental law has changed.364 The crucial language of § 102 of

S. 1075, 91st Cong., 1st Sess. (1969) when introduced did not contain the "Policy Title." It was, however, the subject of the only public hearings held by the U.S. Senate Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs. The companion bill in the House, H.R. 12549, did not contain a policy title at introduction or when it passed the House on 23 September 1969.
